## ADDENDUM

## RE: STRENGTHENING PROCUREMENT FUNCTIONS DURING EMERGENCY/COVID-19 SITUATION AND ENHANCEMENT OF SMES PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT CONTRACTS.

Further to our earlier circular letter No. DSPPC/PRPI/76/9 dated 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2020 on the above subject, and in the light of the imperatives of active participation of SMEs in Government procurement processes and contracts, approval has been granted for a number of conditions for their participation as specified in the Guidelines issued together with the said circular, to be relaxed to enable them participate more actively in the process.

- 2. Consequently, the conditions for the participation of SMEs in the bidding process are relaxed as follows:
  - the annual turnover in relation to the contract sum is relaxed to 1.5 instead of twice the annual turnover. For instance, an SME with an average annual turnover of #Y (Y Naira) can bid for a contract up to (#1.5Y) in value;
  - ii. evidence of past job experience by SMEs is relaxed and not required as pre-qualification document for bidding or for evaluating tenders;
  - iii. Procuring Entities can grant advance payment to SMEs up to a maximum of 40% of the value of the contract.
- 3. While stating that all other criteria specified in the earlier circular still subsist, please give this follow-up circular letter the widest publicity for information and compliance with the adjustments in paragraph 2(i-iii) above.
